Property Summary




- The Paint Lake Road Property consists of 6 claim blocks totaling 3,610 hectares.
- The Property is strategically located 50km west of Wawa, Ontario and along the all- season Paint Lake Road which connects with the Trans Canada Highway
- The claims are contained within the Mishibishu Greenstone Belt which hosts the Eagle River Gold Mine and Mishi Open Pit belonging to Wesdome Mines.
- This area also hosts the former Magnacon Mine (Wesdome) and the Dorset Zone belonging to Angus Ventures which hosts non-compliant resources of 100,000 oz. Au
- The Mishibishu Greenstone Belt is a structurally active belt with multiple gold occurrences, mines and deposits intimately associated with deformation zones
- The Paint Lake Property straddles the Pukaskwa Deformation Zone, a prominent gold-bearing structure that has seen little attention.
- Regionally the Mishibishu Greenstone Belt has really seen little exploration attention since 2006 when Trelawney Resources delineated the Dorset Zone
- The belt has recently been consolidated and Frontline's property is strategically located around the Mishi Open Pit and the former Magnacon Mine







Regional Geology, Mineral Occurrences and Structure




The Paint Lake Road Property is centered on numerous structural corridors intimately associated with current and past producing mines and multiple gold occurrences.



Shaded Topographic Relief








Mineral Occurrences and Related Structure






